

The Coryell County Commissioners Court convened at 9:00 a.m. with a quorum present for a Budget Workshop. County Judge John Firth presided over the meeting. County Judge John Firth called the meeting to order, led the invocation and the Pledge to American and Texas Flags.

1. Justin Carothers Tax Assessor spoke to the court on the Certified Tax Roll that was given to him last week from the Appraisal District Office.
2. Dusty Boyd, District Attorney stated how the new 440th District Court would be an advantage to move cases faster for the District Court Docket and told the court that if there is two courts they can still have jury trials and not have to have a visiting Judge to hear other cases. He also discussed several items on the budget he presented.
3. Mental Health Deputy Sargent Fox let the court know that the Central County Services would fund the equipment, a car and the uniform for a new employee only if the county would fund the position and the second vehicle.
4. County Road and Bridge administrator Justin Latham spoke to the Court about the budget he presented and the equipment that he requested in his budget.


The court recessed this meeting and entered into an executive session. The court returned to open session with no action resulting from the executive session.

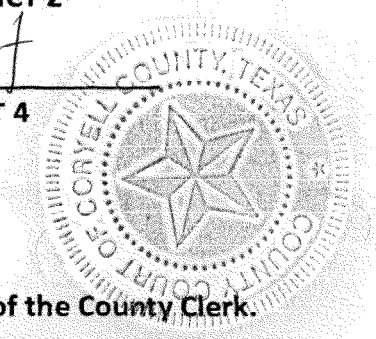

JACK WALL, PRECINCT 1
